AGRINEWS DECEMBER 2023



As we approach the end of 2023, I want to express my gratitude to all our milk suppliers for their ongoing commitment and support during what has been a challenging year for the Irish and global dairy industry.

Over the past 12 months, we have witnessed a shift in dairy market dynamics, reversing the trend that prevailed in late 2021 and much of 2022. Dairy commodity pricing experienced a rapid downward correction from Q4 2022 to Q1 2023 due to an oversupply of dairy on the global market. Although the growth in milk volume output from exporting countries was modest in H2 2022, the decline in dairy demand from China had a significant impact on the supply and demand balance. Input related costs have been declining across 2023 albeit slowly, especially in the case of feed, as the effect of extremely high energy, gas, shipping, and rawmaterial costs work their way through the various supply-chains.

Looking forward to 2024 through the prism of high volatility is very difficult. Dairy markets today are showing signs of modest positivity for 2024.

It seems that markets have rebounded recently based on some uncertainty around milk supply and the availability of dairy next year. The caveat here is that the demand side has not shown any significant signs of recovery with the required structural adjustment in the Chinese market yet to materialise. The robustness of the projected supply-side related recovery remains to be seen in the absence of a demand-side adjustment.

In conclusion, I would like to mark the outstanding performance of John & Olivia Macnamara and family, Gormanstown, Knockainey, Co. Limerick on winning the National Dairy Council & Kerrygold Quality Milk Awards and Robert & Mary Troy and family, Newtownshandrum, Co. Cork on winning the Kerry Agribusiness Quality & Sustainability Awards 2023. These suppliers and all nominees to our Quality & Sustainability Awards exemplify the very best in sustainable farming and farm management across our catchment.
